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Welcome to your Post 16 options in Barnet

A Levels	<p>Advanced level qualifications (known as A Levels) are subject-based qualifications that can lead to university, further study, training, or work. You can normally study three or more A Levels over two years. They're usually assessed by a series of examinations.</p> <p>If you're thinking about going to university, most higher education courses require specific A Levels or combinations of A Levels (or alternative level 3 qualifications). If you're not sure what career or job you want to do, studying a selection of A Levels can be a good way of keeping your options open.</p>
BTECs	<p>BTEC stands for the Business and Technology Education Council. BTECs are specialist work-related qualifications that combine practical learning with subject and theory content. BTECs are designed for young people interested in a particular sector or industry but who are not yet sure what job they'd like to do. You could study a BTEC at Level 2 or 3, either alongside academic qualifications or as part of a wider programme (such as an apprenticeship). You can also study a BTEC as a standalone course.</p>
Cambridge Technicals	<p>Cambridge Technicals are vocational qualifications at Level 2 and Level 3 for students aged 16+. They're designed with the workplace in mind and provide a high-quality alternative to A Levels with a great range of subjects to choose from.</p>
T Levels <i>Available in Barnet from September 2023</i>	<p>T Levels are an alternative to A Levels, apprenticeships and other 16 to 19 courses. Equivalent to 3 A Levels, a T Level focuses on students developing the knowledge, attitude and practical skills required to be able to progress into skilled employment, higher study or an apprenticeship. A T Level is constructed of core theory, occupational skills and a 45 day Industry Placement.</p>

BELS Post 16 Projects & Programmes

BELS offers a variety of Post 16 services to support young people with the information, advice and guidance they need to succeed in the classroom and in their careers.

Our highly qualified team works in schools, colleges and a wide range of community venues working with over 3,500 young people each year to equip them with the skills, knowledge and support they need to achieve the career they want.

Careers advice for young people in Barnet Provided by BEETS

Barnet Education, Employment and Training Support

Our service provides careers guidance, information and advice for young people in Barnet after leaving Year 11 until the age of 19 (or 25 for young people with statements/EHCP).

All young people now need to continue in learning at least until their 18th birthday. This is called Raising the Participation Age (RPA)

We can advise you on the following options:

- Remaining in full time education or training in a school, college or with a training provider
- Applying for an Apprenticeship, Traineeship or Supported Internship
- Getting a job, becoming self-employed or a volunteer for more than twenty hours a week, including doing part-time training or education alongside (usually approximately one day a week)

Programmes for young people aged 14-20 who are in care or at risk of youth offending

These programmes provide support to help you find employment, apprenticeship or training, to launch your career. You will be allocated a dedicated Caseworker who will provide one-to-one support with:

- developing your CV
- careers advice
- job searching
- completing applications
- interview practice

You will also have access to a Mentor who will help build your confidence and motivation if you also feel this would be helpful.

Your Caseworker or Mentor will continue to provide ongoing support for at least the first six months of any role or course you start.

All referrals are through your Social Worker, Personal Adviser or a Health Care Provider. The Caseworker will also work closely with the Personal Adviser or Social Worker and Mentor to ensure consistency and avoid 'duplication' of actions.

Routes into Construction/Employment Programme

This is a free, short pre-employment course to prepare, train and guide candidates through each stage of a traineeship/apprenticeship/job application. The course includes tailored support and training to help you pass the specific assessments, works on CV improvement, communication skills and builds job specific knowledge. Our dedicated careers advisors will guide and support you on your chosen path.

Programme overview

• Introduction

Routes into Construction/Employment is a programme designed to prepare young people for work or Further Education through training coupled with work experience in a range of industries.

• Who is the training programme for?

You are eligible to join the course, if you are not in full-time employment, full-time training or an apprenticeship.

• What is taught on the training programme?

For individuals who follow the construction pathway young people will study for the Construction Health & Safety Level 1 Award. They will also focus on personal development skills for successful employment, CV writing, interview skills and will complete a work placement in a construction company.

For other industries, individuals will be taught personal development skills to ensure successful employment and employment advisers will work with candidates on CV writing and interview skills. We encourage and work with candidates to create a personal development plan which outlines goals and targets to improve your career and overall well-being.

• What qualifications will I gain?

For those on the construction pathway, anyone wishing to be employed on a construction site is required to hold a CSCS card. As part of the training, you will be entered for the Health and Safety and Environmental exam and if successful you will be able to apply for the CSCS card.

• What happens at the end of the programme?

At the end of the training programme, you will continue to receive support from Routes into Construction/Employment Team to enable you to obtain sustained employment and / or training. Our employment advisers will stay in contact with young people to ensure they maintain sustainment in either employment, an apprenticeship or training for up to six months. We encourage you to speak with us about you are getting on and whether you are experiencing any issues in the place of employment or training. Should candidates require our services, you are encouraged to contact us and we will do our best to support you. In other instances where a young person may need help with emotional or mental wellbeing, we will do our best to refer them to the appropriate agencies.

T-LEVELS



WELCOME TO THE NEXT LEVEL

An alternative to A Levels, T Levels are high-quality, classroom-based technical programmes which give young people the technical and practical skills needed to be an asset in the workplace. T Levels are a 2 year qualification and give you a head start towards the career you want.

The government developed T Levels to deliver world class technical education and provide you with a new exciting choice after GCSEs.

LEARN YOUR WAY

T Levels involve more classroom study than apprenticeships, which means you can experience an industry while you continue your studies.

Like A Levels, there are no tuition fees to study a T Level if you start before you are 19. Schools and colleges set their own entry requirements, so check their website or contact them direct to find out more.

T LEVEL SUBJECTS

The first T Levels were introduced in September 2020, more T Levels will continue to be rolled out during the next couple of years. There will be more than 20 available covering a range of subjects from digital to health and engineering to science.

GET AHEAD IN YOUR CAREER

T Levels give you the chance to learn what a real career is like while you continue your studies.

Your industry placement will last for at least 45 days – when and how you complete it depends on the T Level, college/school and employer.

INDUSTRY PLACEMENT

This provides you with an invaluable opportunity to put the learning, knowledge and skills developed in school/ college into practice in a real workplace. An Industry Placement will mean you are work ready in your chosen career pathway.

CREATED WITH EMPLOYERS

T Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need.

More than 250 businesses – including Fujitsu and Skanska – have been involved so you can be confident your T Level will move you to the next level.

QUALIFICATIONS THAT COUNT

When you pass your T Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved – pass, merit, distinction or distinction*. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or a higher apprenticeship.

AWARDED UCAS POINTS

Your T Level will be worth UCAS points and will be recognised by universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.

How do T Level grades work?

T Level grades will be given as:


Pass	Merit	Distinction	Distinction*
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T Levels provide several progression options to students, these include skilled employment, an apprenticeship and higher education. To help T Level students get into higher education, UCAS tariff points are allocated to T Levels.

Students must achieve at least a pass in all elements of the qualification to attract UCAS points.

T Level students spend 80% of the course in the classroom, learning the skills that employers need. The other 20% is a meaningful industry placement, where they put these skills into action.

A supported internship is a transition to work programme where young people with an EHC Plan can learn about the workplace by being in work. Interns are based at The Whittington Hospital five days a week for an academic year (Sept – July). The site is staffed by a qualified teacher and job coaches to meet educational and training needs. Through a series of three targeted internships, interns acquire competitive, marketable, and transferable skills to enable them to move into paid employment.

Candidates must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible to apply for an internship:

- aged 16-25 years old with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan
- be an autistic young person or have a related learning difficulty
- have an interest to move into employment
- be an independent traveller or working towards

Project Choice



Health Education England (HEE) provides supported internships for learners who have an Education Health & Care Plan, through a programme service-provider called 'Project Choice'.

Project Choice is a Specialist Post-16 College that delivers an OFSTED and Education Skills Funding Agency approved curriculum, that links into additional NCFE accredited provision. All educational-based delivery is embedded into a learner's work-place training and learning.

We have over 150 learners across several local authorities, in the UK and our staff work closely with over 14 National Health Service (NHS) trusts. Project Choice provides learners with the opportunity to complete up to three work-role rotations, most of which are in hospitals but some placements have occurred in private or public-sector settings.

Project Choice also make provision for enhancing a learner's literacy and numeracy skills. English and mathematics skills are embedded within our supported internship programme; and accreditation can arrange if and where applicable.

Entry requirements for this programme are that students are aged 16-24, have a learning disability and an Education, Health and Care Plan in place, who also:

- would like to find a job
- will be ready for work after completing the programme
- will be able to travel independently by the end of the programme

Programme

The internship programme is a full-time study programme that runs throughout the academic year (September to July)

- Interns will be offered up to three placements, lasting 10-12 weeks each
- Four days per week are spent in the work place, with one day in the classroom.
- Interns are supported by a Workplace Mentor, Project Coordinator and an Area Manager. Students may benefit from the support of a Job Coach, in the work place, on a daily basis should they require one.
- In the classroom, Interns learn about employment and develop employability skills, as well as having study time to improve Maths and English.

Post Internship

Interns are supported after their internship ends. Sustaining employment is key to us and we are committed to helping Interns to achieve this objective in addition to their additional goals.

- **Finance Administrator** – Computer data entry, working with excel, sending emails, filing, photocopying, collecting and distributing post.
- **Catering** – Assist with picking and packing of hospital meals. Assist with the delivery of meals to patients and colleagues in both public & private care.
