Identify young people who are at Risk of NEET in schools/ colleges in Barnet, provide support to move them in EET.

Increase the number of young people with EHCP's undertaking Supported Internships and then moving into employment.

Increase the number of careleavers who are EET, decrease the number of NEET and not in education of those young people working with the Youth Justice Team.

Extend the opportunities for young people to access vocational and technical programmes by developing vocational pathways and the curriculum through partnerships and collaborative approaches with post-16 providers.

Minimise the number of young people who are NEET, by developing the employability skills and resilience of young people and by ensuring excellent transition support and interventions for all young people, especially those at risk of becoming NEET or who are already NEET.

Increase the opportunities for disadvantaged young people to progress to suitable education, training and employment, including care leavers, youth offenders and young people with special educational needs and disabilities.


