

PERINATAL MENTAL HEALTH Covid-19 CARE PATHWAY

Woman identified at risk at booking (Whooley questions – additional questions on past and current psychiatric history, prescribed psychiatric medication)

No mental health risks identified: continue standard care.

Housing, isolation, domestic violence, adjustment to life events – offer reassurance and link with relevant agencies.

Some non-government organisations still offer generic support remotely **Mild/moderate illness**: refer to local IAPT (GP aligned)

Psychological treatment including brief interventions for Covid-19 related anxiety offered over the phone. IAPT are currently not accepting self-referrals.

Moderate to severe mental illness (active or in remission):

Current level of staffing in the perinatal team:

- At least two members of staff on site
- Admin team on site Mon-Fri, 9am-5pm
- The rest of the team works from home when not on site

Face to face assessment and reviews are limited to cases where telephone/video consultation is not possible or appropriate.



Referral screening and allocation

- Referrals screened by the admin team.
- Allocation confirmed at weekly MDT meeting and appointment arranged.
- Referrer, GP and woman informed of subsequent arrangements.



Antenatal Mental Health Care (community clinics)

- Psychiatric assessment and follow up reviews over the telephone/ video call
- Adult and child safeguarding liaison as usual
- 32 weeks pre-birth planning meeting over the telephone/ video call
- Perinatal Mental Health Care Plan (only for severe mental illness i.e. schizophrenia, bipolar affective disorder, schizoaffective disorder, recurrent depression, severe and disabling OCD, severe depression, severe personality disorder etc.) emailed to maternity
- Advice available over the telephone during working hours
- Preconception advice still offered routinely over the telephone/video call



Intra-partum and post-partum care

- Review on labour ward/postnatal ward by phone if possible, face to face only if strictly necessary (dependant on maternity site this is done by the hospital mental health liaison team).
- Capacity to consent to treatment assessed over the telephone when possible or face to face
- Medication advice, including rapid tranquilization advice by phone and/or documented in mental health care plan



Postnatal care

- Psychiatric reviews over the telephone/ video call, or face to face if strictly necessary with PPF
- Bonding/attachment screening can still be carried out over the telephone liaison with health visiting/child safeguarding via telephone or emails
- · Family education and support, including support to partners offered over the telephone

- Woman on the maternity ward: contact the 24 hour hospital mental health liaison team (via bleep or hospital switchboard)
- Perinatal mental health team staff member available during working hours for non-urgent telephone advice on management, face to face assessments and reviews on the ward.

Perinatal Mental Health Education and Training to allied professionals

- These activities are routinely temporarily suspended, with occasional exception
- PMH staff member is available over the telephone for advice, guidance and signposting to relevant resources (please refer to appendix)
