



Over the last **10 years**:


- PMLD +40%


More pupils with EHCPs in Special Schools







How many CYP in Barnet have an EHCP?










How many CYP in Barnet are at SEN Support?










What are the needs of CYP in Barnet?



Currently 96,000 children 2017 – 2040 - 11.5% increase



Overall educational attainment of children with SEN in Barnet is positive

- Early years pupils with SEN with a Statement or ECH Plan are performing better than the national average
- Pupils in Key Stage 1 both with and without a statement or plan are performing better than the national average
- Pupils in Key Stage 2 both with and without a statement or plan are performing better than the national average
- Pupils with SEN support at Key Stage 4 are performing above national average



- Early years pupils with SEN without a statement are achieving below the London average
- Pupils with a statement or plan at KS4 are performing below national average









Education Strategy: SEND Aims



 - an LNI team offering differentiated support to maintained schools and academies






Education Strategy: SEND Aims
