- Representations must relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
- It is an offence liable on conviction to a fine up to £5000 under Section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003 knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with an application.
- Please note that if the licensing authority does not receive any valid representations it must grant the licence as proposed in the application. If valid representations are received, the application will be determined by the licensing sub-committee

Activities applied for	<p>A variation application seeking to allow:-</p> <p>The Forum is a Student Cafe Bar for the Hendon Campus of Middlesex University, located on the first floor of the Student Centre. The Forum includes a lounge, seating area, DJ booth, DJ stage and further stage, dance floor/ entertainment area, a pool table area and a bar counter and also incorporates a 'food court' with various counters for different types of food. These facilities are mainly used by students of Middlesex University, university staff and guests of either the students, staff or university body. Access to the new Student Centre is controlled via the university access control system and only students/ staff with cards (and their guests) are permitted to access the building.</p> <p>This application for variation is for approval of amended plans of the premises as follows:</p> <p>1. To approve an amended internal layout of the lounge and bar area of the student centre following a refurbishment of this area, as more particularly shown on the plans submitted with this application. The changes to the existing approved layout</p>

	<p>include: a reconfiguration and relocation of the bar counter; removal of a back of house store, entertainment office and cash office and replacement with fixed booth seating; and, in the common/ function room, reconfiguration of the furniture to include fixed bench and booth seating, removal of 'market trader' booths and relocation of the DJ booth.</p> <p>2. To include an external area for a maximum of six outdoor events per calendar year and include the sale of alcohol, regulated entertainment and/ or late night refreshment outdoors. The proposed external area is more particularly shown on the site plan submitted with this application. There is no proposed change to the activities or times authorised under the licence and the existing conditions will continue to apply. However, we have also proposed a number of additional conditions in relation to the proposed outdoor events, as more particularly detailed in part 16 of this application.</p> <p>The University has extensive CCTV provision and the campus has its own control room which is manned by contract security. The CCTV is managed by the University security department of the Estate and Facilities Management Service.</p> <p>In addition the campus is monitored by University Hendon Campus security. There is already a condition on the licence requiring CCTV.</p>
