This is a free workshop for Barnet parents and carers that has been jointly organised by education and representatives of the Barnet SEND parent community.

The workshop is an opportunity for the Barnet community to learn more about how we can work together to prepare our children and young people for adulthood from their earliest years. Young people need to be supported to achieve a level of independence, good health, friendships, relationships, community inclusion and employment. The workshop talks about early planning for these outcomes from the earliest years and is aimed at parents / carers of children and of young people with SEND from pre-school to age 25 years.

Our speaker, Linda Jordan, is from National Development team for Inclusion (NDTI). Linda has worked for the NDTi Valuing People Team from 2002 until March 2011. She was the London regional adviser and the lead for transition. In 2008 Linda became the joint programme manager for Getting a Life while continuing to lead on transition for the Team. Linda is the parent of a woman with a learning disability.

The workshop aims to:

- provide an update on the national context and developments from education, health and social care with regards to meeting the Preparing for Adulthood needs of children and young people (0-25) with SEND in Barnet.
- offer a question and answer session to provide an opportunity for parents / carers and professionals
- present the 'Barnet Multi-Agency Preparation for Adulthood (PfA) Protocol' and how this can be accessed and utilised by both parents / carers and professionals
- hear from Barnet's Parent / Carer Forum (BPCF) about their role and work they are currently undertaking
- present information about the Maximising the Impact of Teaching Assistants project in Barnet and how this supports learning and promoting independence.
