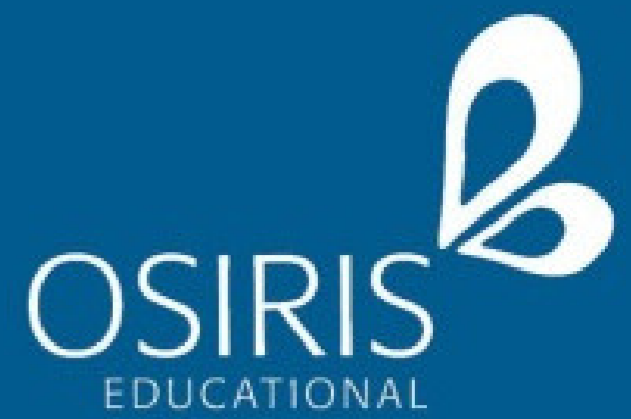


Teaching Boys
